

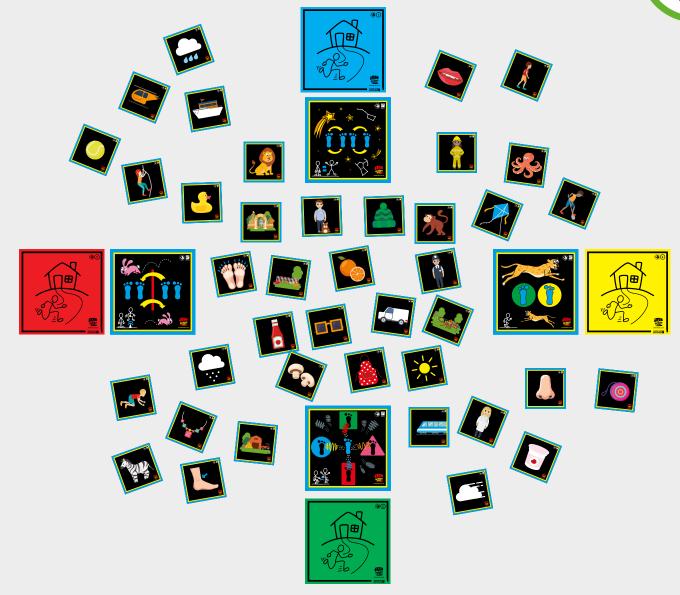
# **Lesson 1**Colours

### What's needed

X4 Coloured House mats X4 Mini Action Mats X40 Picture Mats (all)

### Main Activity Setup







### **Learning objectives**

To listen attentively and find colours within pictures.

To learn new vocabulary and begin to use it in sentences

To develop confidence when speaking to the group

### Language and Communication ELG

# **Physical Development ELG**

Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing. Move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing.

### Main Activity

Group student into pairs and allocate each pair to a coloured house mat. Ask each pair to stand one behind the other. Explain that each student will take turns to complete 5 repetitions on their Mini Action mat and then go and look for a picture that you request.

#### 1) Red

Ask the first student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with red in it and bring it back to their mat.

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear, concise language where appropriate.

#### 2) Blue

Ask the second student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with blue in it and bring it back to their mat.

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear, concise language where appropriate.

#### 3) Yellow

Ask the first student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with yellow in it and bring it back to their mat.

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear, concise language where appropriate.

#### 4) Green

Ask the second student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with green in it and bring it back to their mat.

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear, concise language where appropriate.

#### 5) Orange

Ask the first student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with orange in it and bring it back to their mat

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear concise language where appropriate.

#### 6) White

Ask the second student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with white in it and bring it back to their mat.

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear, concise language where appropriate.

This way each pair of students will be looking for a different colour to their previous turn.

#### 7) Colour matching home mat

Ask the first student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with the colour that matches their home mat and bring it back.

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear, concise language where appropriate.

\*Now ask the students to rotate and move clockwise to the next coloured mat.

#### 8) Colour matching home mat

Ask the second student to step onto the Mini Action Mat and complete 5 repetitions, counting as a group. Then ask them to find any picture with the colour that matches their home mat and bring it back.

Ask students to hold up their mat and tell the group which picture they chose. Support any children that have struggled and model clear concise, language where appropriate.
